Bowl from a Board: Attendees will discover a rarely used technique to turn their flat scraps into completed and beautiful turnings. Information will include jig and chuck considerations, cutting and gluing techniques, tool considerations, and finishing.

Peppermill: Techniques on good basic design, form and choice of wood for turning a functional piece. The demo will include the process of drilling and turning the piece including sanding and finishing.

Segmented Bowl: Segmented turning produces an elegant and eye catching woodturning that is really easier than normal woodturning. This demo will include how to design a segmented bowl. This includes an accurate cutting method for the segments, glue up, and turning.

Three winged bowl: This bowl is turned from a 4x4 square cube. The demonstration will cover the tools, how they are used, and how to turn a cube into a bowl safely.

Multi-center turning: is made easy using a side-ground bowl gouge to get a skew like surface. After using four centers to cut the three faces of the triangle the fun begins.

Natural edge bowl: Starting with a green half log a bowl is turned. Learn about the tools to use, wood selection, blank preparation, mounting, techniques to produce pleasing curves and smooth surfaces, and drying the bowl successfully

Bird House ornament: A miniature birdhouse will delight anyone who sees it. learn to turn the nest box, make a hole, create a roof, add a perch and then mount it for miniature birds.

No measure box: Turned boxes are great gifts and sale items following these few simple steps will yield a box with a lid that fits.

wobble: Learn the secrets to this unusual novelty turned as one piece, split and re-joined to form an object that rolls in a straight wobbly line.

Bowl from a crotch: These bowls feature the prettiest wood you can find in most trees. Learn how to select and prepare blanks, align the wing, and turn a finished bowl than need little sanding.
